Getting off to a good start

The first few weeks at school are about establishing ongoing relationships and good practices to lay the foundation for a positive and productive year ahead.

Each fortnight classes will be focussing on one of the **Life Rafts** from the Play is the Way program. This program supports children with their personal and social development and provides a shared language to support school and class agreements around acceptable actions and behaviours. In weeks 2 & 3 the Life Raft that we will be focussing on is:

Treat others as you would like to be treated....
(The Golden Rule)

If someone is unlike you, seek to understand them. You will get along with others, work as a team, accept that everyone is different and value what they have to offer.

In conjunction with this we will also work with students in further developing their Powerful Learner Qualities starting with the Optimistic powerful learner quality in week 2 and the Communicator powerful learning quality in week 3. A brochure outlining our Powerful Learner Qualities has been included in this newsletter for your Information.

The Life Rafts develop students socially and the powerful learning qualities assist students to understand themselves as learners. The two work together to support student success at school.

Pupil Free Day

On Monday 26 of February Teachers from Callington Primary School will be joining other teachers and leaders from our Partnership to attend a training around Visible Learning. The Visible Learning Framework is something that Callington Primary School, along with the Heysen Partnership (the group of schools that we are connected with) have committed to for 3 years, and this professional learning session will continue the work commenced in 2017. Staff will participate in two further professional learning days on Visible Learning with the Heysen Partnership this year on Friday 29 June and Friday 21 September. Murraylands Catastrophic Days

A REMINDER TO PARENTS THAT OUR SCHOOL IS CLOSED ON DAYS THAT ARE CLASSIFIED AS CATASTROPHIC IN THE MURRAYLANDS FIRE DISTRICT.

We are required to practice our bushfire invacuation procedures at least 4 times during the bushfire season.

Therefore there will be 2 drills carried out in term one and 2 drills in term four in order for everyone on the site to be familiar with and understand their responsibilities in the event of a bush fire threatening our school. Teachers have been discussing the procedures with classes.

Hot Weather


There have been a couple of hot days at school this term. If the temperature is predicted as being above 38 degrees according to the Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) students will be allowed to play outside during Recess time with teachers ensuring that students are wearing hats and have sunscreen applied. Students will be encouraged to play games in the shade. If the temperature is 38 degrees or above at 12 noon according to BOM children will not be allowed to play outside and will spend lunchtime play in the library where it is air-conditioned and children can access board games, the computer, books and television.

During Term 1,3 and 4 all students and staff are expected to wear hats when outside. Parents are asked to please apply sunscreen before school during these terms and all classes have sunscreen for reapplication during the day. If students are not wearing a hat when outside they will be asked to play under block shade. School hats can be purchased at the office.

Attendance

Regular attendance and participation in schooling is an important factor in educational and life success. Students who skip school or have frequent lateness are at risk of alienation from education that can lead to decreased options for future pathways.

If for some reason your child is absent from school eg; illness it is the responsibility of parents/caregivers of their child's absence by calling the school or using the report absence link on the school website. If a child is absent and the school has not been informed of a reason the class teacher will send a note home requesting the reason for absence. If after 3 attempts of requesting this information the parents will be contacted by the Principal.

If your child is late to school or needs to leave school early they need to be signed in/out at the front office by an adult to inform the school of the reason for the lateness or need to leave early. Once again if there is no reason given the teacher will send a note home requesting a reason for lateness or early departure, following the same procedure for unknown absence.

If you are aware that your child will be absent for a long period time eg; more than 3 days you need request an attendance exemption which is to be signed by the Principal.

RESOURCE CENTRE

The Premiers Reading Challenge is an important focus where teachers, parents and students work together for the students success.

Our students participate in the Premier's Reading Challenge every year and are required to read 12 books from the PRC booklist at the appropriate literacy level for each student. They are encouraged to challenge themselves and to dig deep and read more.

PRC will start in Term 1 until the beginning of September. Students receive awards each year.

The awards are as follows:

- · Certificate completing the challenge for the first time
- · Bronze medal- completing the challenge for the second time
- · Silver medal completing the challenge for the third time
- · Gold medal- completing the challenge for the fourth time
- · Champion Medal completing the challenge for the fifth time
- Legend medal completing the challenge for the sixth time
- · Hall of fame Medal completing the challenge for the seventh time
- · Hall of Fame reader for life Certificate- completing the challenge for the eighth time

A big Thank you to the parents and students who brought back any overdue books from last year. If you can't find them and have looked **everywhere** let me know so we can adjust the library records.




What's new in Room 7

This year all students at Callington Primary School will be attending Health and Physical Education, and Science and Technology lessons (STEM)

What is STEM?

STEM stands for Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics. It is a crossdisciplinary subject that provides students the opportunity to develop real solutions to real life problems, to explore technology in a hands on manner and to develop their science understanding through practical experiences. Each class is undertaking a STEM project this term. The year 5/7's are building a car powered by a mouse trap, the 3/4's are learning to write programs using Scratch and the R/2's are investigating sound and music and will be building their own musical instrument. We are looking for any spare tissue or shoe boxes you may have at home for this musical instrument project. If you could send them in it would be greatly appreciated.





Health and Physical Education

H & P.E. teaches students to stay healthy in body and mind. It involves strategies for keeping ourselves safe, looking after the physical health of our body's through healthy diet and exercise and learning new skills and sports. This term we have the South Australia Cricket Association coming up to run a clinic for us. This will take place on Wednesday 21st of this month. As we will be running, jumping and moving during P.E. lessons it is important that students have the proper equipment to keep themselves safe.
