The show is a highly interactive, culturally rich, informative, professional presentation by authentic visiting artists from Ghana, West Africa. Bringing literally hundreds of drums to our school so that every student will learn and play an African rhythm. Salaka will transform our students into a percussion ensemble led by our Master Drummers and Dancers from Africa. The students will also learn a traditional African song to accompany the drumming rhythm, and experience African dancing. As well as being very involved, the students will learn about African instruments, hear stories of African children growing up in the villages, and witness traditional African dances as they are performed in Ghana.


